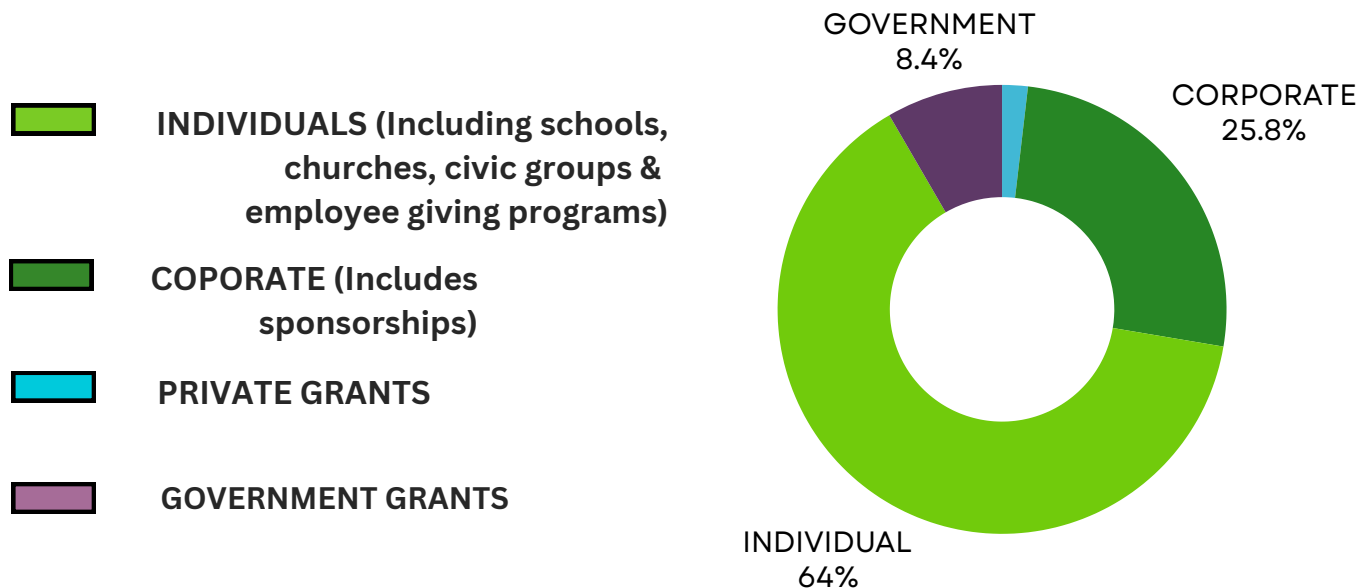

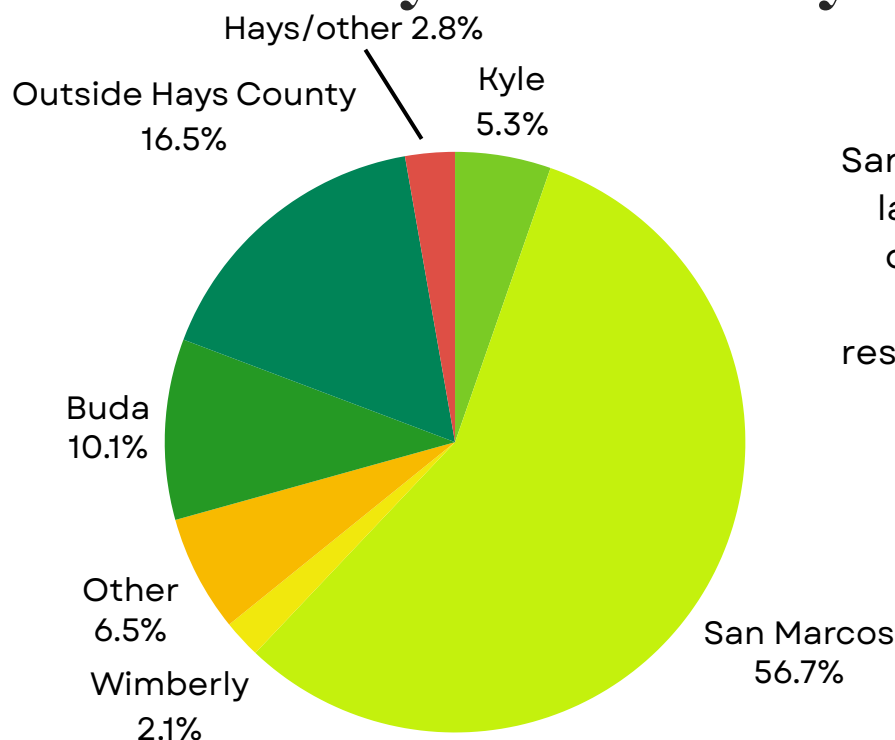


## OUR FUNDING

San Marcos residents are the largest source of individual donations for Hays County Food Bank. Many of the residents recognize the work we do to benefit their community and are generous in their support.

# COMMUNITY IMPACT

In 2023, more than **1 in 7** of Hays County residents lacked access to enough nutritious food. Feeding America estimates that there are **36,140 individuals** facing food insecurity in our county. Of those experiencing hunger, more than **9,000 are children.**



**1,300,333 pounds** of food distributed

**177,472** clients received food assistance



**55,435** households served in 2023

Collaborated with **27 Last-Mile Sites** to serve as distribution locations



**44,934** children and their households were helped through school pantries that received food at no cost.

**858,220** pounds of perishable food distributed. This includes vegetables, fruits, and dairy items.



**24,440** lbs of food waste was donated to local farms and gardens to be used as animal feed and composting.

**5,304 new households** were served through Hays County FoodBank distributions

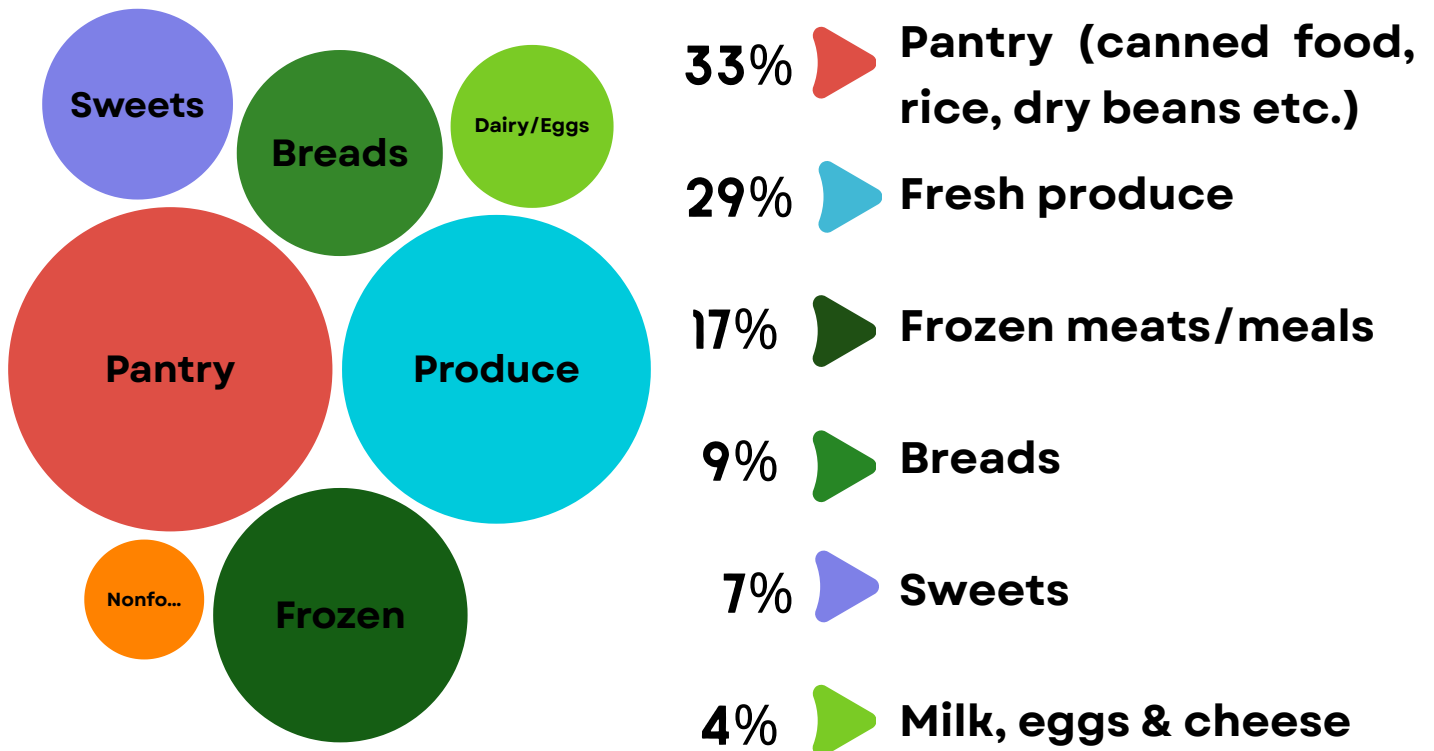

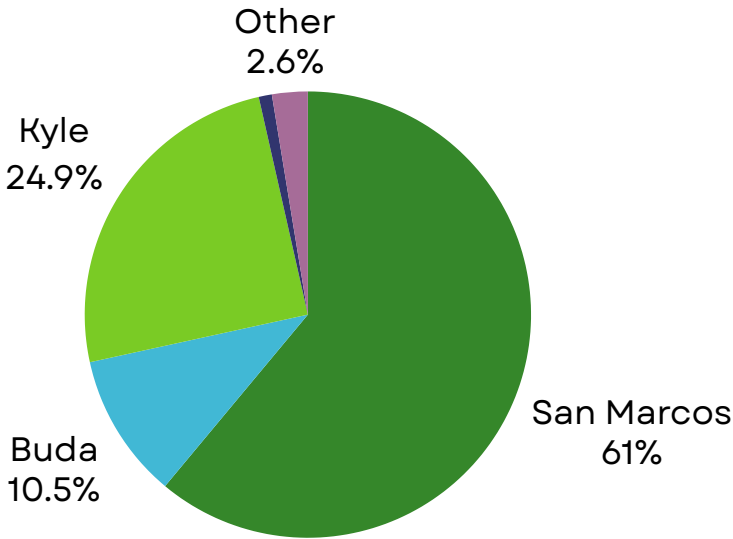
## Breakdown of Food Distributed



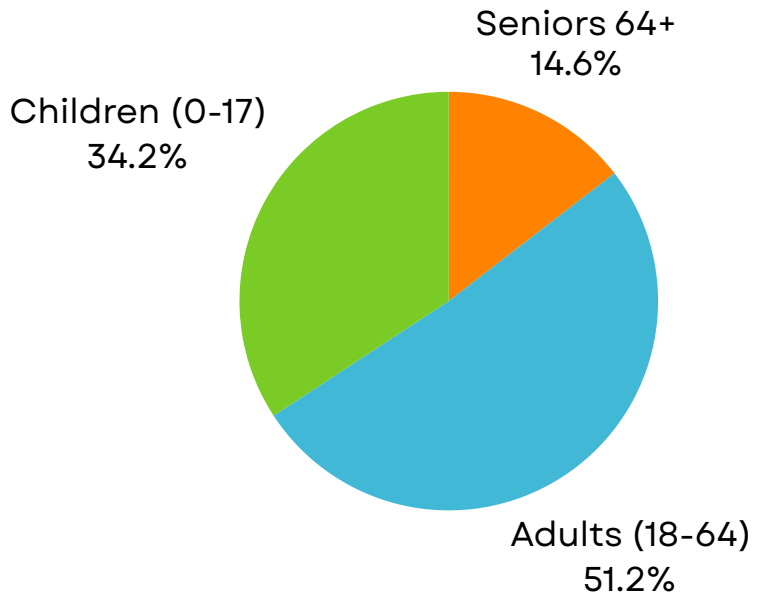
