



COMMUNITY IMPACT

In 2023, more than **1 in 7** of Hays County residents lacked access to enough nutritious food. Feeding America estimates that there are **36,140 individuals** facing food insecurity in our county. Of those experiencing hunger, more than **9,000 are children**.





1,300,333 pounds of food distributed

177,472 clients received food assistance





55,435 households served in 2023

Collaborated with **27 Last-Mile Sites** to serve as distribution locations





44,934 children and their households were helped through school pantries that received food at no cost.

858,220 pounds of perishable food distributed. This includes vegetables, fruits, and dairy items.





24,440 lbs of food waste was donated to local farms and gardens to be used as animal feed and composting.

5,304 new households were served through Hays County Food Bank distributions



Breakdown of Food Distributed




